INAUGURATION OF THE PROVISIONAL ROTARY CLUB OF KIHIFI 24TH SEPT 2011

On Friday 23 September, six Rotarians led by Pres. Alfred Okot Okidi braved over 400 miles to Kihifi near the border of DRC in Kanungu District, to inaugurate the Provisional Rotary Club of Kihifi.

Early the next morning, Saturday 24 September, over 50 prospective Rotarians had already filled the tented shed near Suba Motel where we were accommodated.



After Constituting the Assembly into a Provisional RC of Kihifi, President Alfred made an hour-long presentation of what Rotary is about.

Other presentations were given by, Rtn. Tugume Rugasira, Rtn. Galabuzi, Rtn. Serugo, PP Bakojja and Rtn. Ayebare.

The area of focus covered, among others; a) Registration of clubs as Legal Entities to enable them qualify for projects; b) Club attendance through weekly meetings, seminars & Governor's visitations; c) Financial commitments to the Club, District and Rotary Dues; d) Recruitment & Retention of Rotarians; e) Classifications; f) The role of a Club Secretary; g) E-Learning; h) Rotary Basics for new members; i) Implementation of Club Projects; j) Participation in Rotary Activities; k) Invitation of Guest Speakers; l) New Generations; and m) Club Finances.

The President donated a flash disc to the new club containing important Rotary information including the Manual of Procedure.

Due to the long distance from Kampala to Kihifi, the RC of Rukungiri was requested to regularly visit Kihifi on behalf of the DG's Representative who might not be able to make it often. We
